"The Story" of Round Lake's Property

Founding/Campside Date: 1949

Acreage: 67 Acres

Investment: \$37,000

The Story: In 1949, Round Lake Christian Camp was transformed from a dream into reality as the Holmes County Men's Fellowship felt called to found a camp. After much prayer and consideration, they were led to Mr. Lehman, who owned a 25-acre lake surrounded by 42 acres of land in Ashland County. He agreed to sell the property for \$3,000 under his asking price so the land could be a tool in God's ministry.

Lodae

Date: 1977 Acreage: 9.79 Acres Investment: \$8,000

The Story: For years, others had attempted to purchase this tract of land just off State Route 3 with no success. Then, the Penn family was invited to see the camp in action. They were so inspired by what they saw that they not only sold the property to the camp but also made additional contributions to its ministry.

Retreat Center

Date: 1998

Acreage: 22.39 Acres

Investment: \$130,000

The Story: As the camp prepared to break ground on its \$1.2 million Retreat Center, the tract of land behind it came available for sale. This purchase opened up space to relocate the Retreat Center to a better spot. It also ocreated room for the parking lot and RV park, as well as adding a storage barn and farmhouse for staff housing. God truly blessed the camp through the timing of this opportunity as it enhanced the setting of the Retreat Center.

Golf Course

Date: 2015

Acreage: 62.97 Acres

Investment: \$450,000

The Story: Several offers were on the table for the land directly across the road from the camp, yet not one of them was accepted. Founded in 1928, the golf course was in jeopardy of being closed and perhaps subdivided. This possibility caused concern for the security and privacy of the camp borders. As the camp began to negotiate in an effort to protect its borders, a vision grew for a new way of doing ministry in the local community. Now, the Round Lake Golf Course is owned and operated by Round Lake Christian Camp and has become a unique place of outreach in the community.

Lakefront

Date: 2016

Acreage: 11.93 Acres

Investment: \$63.000

The Story: The camp had long dreamed of owning the final corner of the lake which was under private ownership. As the years passed, it felt the camp may never own it. Of all the land the camp had purchased, this was the one prayed for the most. Once again, God softened hearts and the owners agreed to sell the section of land to the ministry of Round Lake.



Round Lake Development Expenses

The property expansion opportunities over the past few years have led us to borrow \$450,000. We would like to invite you to partner with us in furthering this ministry. We still have about \$450,000 left to pay for the new property. Our goal is to pay the entire amount off during the next four years. So far, we have been paying for the land out of the camp's general fund, but this method has been putting a great strain on our budget and resources. We would like to ask you to join us by making a special donation directed towards the property. This past summer, 2,149 campers attended Round Lake. If just that same number of people were to commit to donating \$4.37 per month (the cost of one coffee drink) over the next four years, the entire property would be paid for. To put this in perspective, over 11,000 people visit Round Lake annually.

Wilderness Camp

Date: 1990

Acreage: 85 Acres

S St Arrest - Parchasad in 1995 for \$19.0

Investment: \$46,000

The Story: Dan Gault dreamed of extending Round Lake's ministry to a second site in Licking County. He had already established a Wilderness Program in this area and envisioned the camp extending its reach there permanently. After the initial property purchase, the camp was able to purchase several smaller tracts to enlarge Wilderness Camp. Round Lake purchased 6.19 acres at Pine Bluff for \$19,000 (1996) and a 2.86 acre piece in the middle of the original 85 acres for \$23,000 (2012). God has blessed the camp with this land to create a unique camp setting for our second campus.
