Generally camps for grades 1-6 are held on Camp Side (north side of the lake).  
Camps for grades 7-12 are held on Lodge Side (south side of the lake).

# Registering for Camp

## Important Things to Know

Grade listed is the grade the camper will be entering in the fall.

## Payment

When registering for camp, a 50% deposit must be provided with the registration form. Registrations will be processed on a first come, first served basis until camp sessions are filled. Camps do fill up, so register early to avoid disappointing your camper! Any declined or overdue payments are subject to a \$25 fee. Registrations received after 12:00 a. m. seven days prior to check-in are subject to a \$25 late fee. The late fee is \$10 for Day Camps and 2-3rd Overnight camp. All registrations must be paid in full no later than 7 days prior to check-in.

**Church sponsorship portion does not apply towards 50% deposit.**

For example, consider a camp costing \$200 with a \$100 church scholarship. The scholarship is applied, cutting the cost down to \$100 for the camper. The camper must then pay the remaining \$100 (which is 50% of the original tuition price) to register for camp.

## How to Register Online

1. Go to [www.roundlake.org](http://www.roundlake.org)
2. Go to TAB: Summer Camp
3. Click on "Summer Camp Schedule"
4. Follow instructions to register camper
5. Payment by debit or credit card only
6. If your church is paying a portion of tuition, you **MUST** contact your church before registering online to receive a scholarship code. Otherwise you will be billed the full tuition amount. Codes **CANNOT** be applied later.

## For Mailed Registrations

Complete and sign registration form. Enclose check, money order, credit card or debit information with required minimum 50% deposit.

Campers will not be registered unless the minimum deposit is received. **Church sponsorship portion does not apply towards 50% deposit.**

## Does a church or organization sponsor some or all of your registration fees?

Many churches choose to generously offer scholarships to campers from their church. Please check with your church to see if they participate in camper tuition assistance.

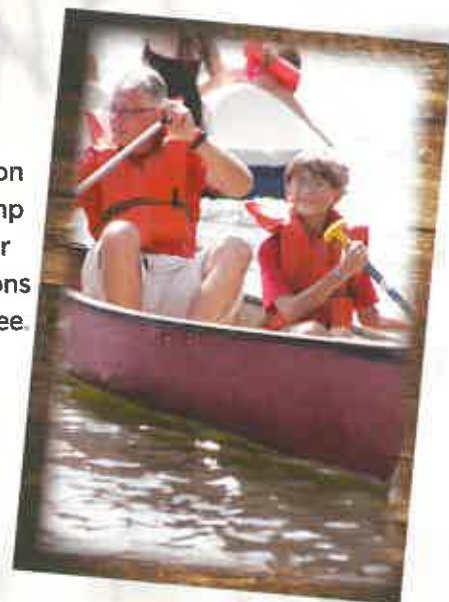

Located on 96 beautiful acres in Licking County, Wilderness Camp is one hour south of the main Round Lake Camp. Wilderness Camp is located one mile north of Fallsburg, Ohio, off State Route 586.

Campers experience a unique outdoor setting focusing on the beauty and importance of God's creation. Hike the rolling trails, attend classes in the great outdoors, leap into the waterhole for a swim, fly down the zip line, rappel off a 38-foot cliff and enjoy worship with other friends at God's throne in the midst of His creation. Does it get any better?

Enjoy a modern shelter furnished with kitchen equipment, eating area, fireplace and flush toilets. Camp out in the woods in a rustic cabin and bathe in the Wakatomika River (with swim suits of course). Now that's wilderness camping!

Transportation to and from Wilderness Base Camp is provided by Round Lake. Camper check-in is conducted at Round Lake Christian Camp in Lakeville, on the Camp Side at 2:30 pm. The bus leaves at 4:00 pm to deliver campers to Wilderness Base Camp in Licking County.

If you prefer to transport your camper directly to the Wilderness Base Camp, you must notify the office at least one week before camp starts. Parents driving directly to Wilderness Camp should arrive at 5:00 P.M.
