

Parent & Camper Information

Our goal is to give your child a fun, meaningful, and memorable camp experience—while also giving you peace of mind. Please take a few minutes to read through this important information as you prepare for the week.

Dorm Assignments

Dorm placement is one of the most challenging parts of organizing camp each year. If your child has one or two friends they would prefer to room with, please contact the camp office with those requests. We will do our best to group campers by church and honor requests when possible, but we cannot guarantee all requests will be fulfilled.

Medications

All medications—including **over-the-counter medicines and vitamins**—must be turned in to the camp nurse at check-in. The nurse will administer all medications as directed. Please send only the amount needed for the week.

Camp Check-In

Check-in will begin at **5:30 PM**. Camp officially starts at **6:00 PM** in the Multipurpose Building. A light meal will be provided Sunday evening.

Closing & Pick-Up

You are invited to join us for our **“Celebration of Baptism”** on Friday at **1:30 PM** in the main worship area, followed by baptisms at the lakefront.

Dismissal will take place at **2:00 PM** from your child’s assigned dorm. Dorms will remain locked until baptisms are complete. If you need to arrange early pickup, please contact the camp in advance.

Baptisms

If your child expresses interest in being baptized, we will contact you before any decision is made. If this is something your child is already considering, we encourage you to discuss it together ahead of time.

Our desire is for each baptism to be meaningful and joyful. Please note that we do not perform re-baptisms; in those cases, we will refer families to their home church for further guidance.

Homesickness & Communication

In accordance with Round Lake guidelines, campers are not permitted to have cell phones or smartwatches.

If your child becomes homesick, they must receive permission from the camp dean to use the camp phone. If you do not hear from us, you can assume your child is doing well and enjoying their week!

Electronics

Camp is a chance to unplug and connect—with God and others. Please leave all electronics at home, including:

- Cell phones
- Smartwatches
- Tablets

Pictures & Privacy

For the safety and privacy of all campers:

No pictures are allowed in dorm rooms or bathrooms.

Photos may only be taken outdoors or in main activity areas. Any device used improperly will be held until the end of the week.

Snacks & Food Policy

Campers will have daily access to the canteen, where they may purchase **two snack items and one drink per day**. Bringing **\$4–\$5 per day** is usually sufficient.

All snacks must be eaten at the canteen—no food is allowed in dorm rooms to prevent bugs and pests.

Please **do not send food, candy, or drinks with your child**, and do not mail food packages during the week.

Spiritual Preparation

As camp approaches, we encourage you to help your child prepare spiritually. **Psalm 56:3–4a** reminds us: *“When I am afraid, I put my trust in you... in God I trust and am not afraid.”*

This week, campers will be challenged to “store up” God’s Word in their hearts. To help them prepare, consider memorizing these passages together:

- Hebrews 11:1
- John 20:29
- 1 Peter 1:8–9
- 1 John 4:11–12
- Romans 8:24–25
- 2 Corinthians 4:16–18
- Colossians 1:15–16
- Psalm 23

Missions

Throughout the week, campers will learn about and support a Christian mission. Each day will include a “Mission Moment,” and campers will have the opportunity to give toward spreading the Gospel. Please pray that God will use these offerings to make an impact.

What to Bring

- Bible (NIV preferred, but any version is fine)
- Notebook and pen/pencil
- Drawstring bag
- Refillable water bottle
- Flashlight

Dress Code

Modesty is the standard. Please ensure clothing is appropriate in fit and messaging.

- One-piece swimsuits are required
- Tankinis are acceptable if modest
- Two-piece suits must be covered with a dark t-shirt

Theme Days

Campers are encouraged to join the fun of each theme day by dressing up:

- **Monday:** Camouflage Day (UNSEEN-what we cannot see)
- **Tuesday:** Jungle/Safari Day (all things created)
- **Wednesday:** Mismatch/Crazy outfit Day (Things don’t always make sense, but we still believe)
- **Thursday:** Neon Party Day (rejoice with joy and celebration)
- **Friday:** High-Five Friday (nothing needed but an encouraging High-Five whenever we meet.)
