



Camping Policies

Updated July 28, 2020

All participants must adhere to all federal, state and local regulations related to COVID-19 which are in effect at the time of the event including but not limited to the use of masks and social distancing. Thank you in advance for your cooperation!

Thank you for keeping Round Lake pet, smoke, drug and alcohol free throughout the camp! Below are a few guidelines to follow to make this an enjoyable time for everyone:

- If you or a household member has experienced a fever, cough, sore throat or another flu-like symptom, we ask that you stay home
- If you or a household member has traveled to a high-risk area or been in contact with a person infected with COVID-19, we ask that you stay home
- Masks should be worn in accordance with any federal, state or local mandates in effect
- We ask you to maintain a minimum of six feet distance between unrelated persons from separate sites
- We recommend regular handwashing and other safety precautions
- Children are the responsibility of their parents or guardians. Please ensure your children are safe and follow all camp rules.
- "Gray Water" is not to be discharged from your camper on the campground
- Retreat Center and Boys Dorm Shower House are open for toilet and shower use only
- Do your part—keep toilets flushed and restrooms clean
- Small children should be accompanied by a reliable adult in all restrooms
- Campground speed limit: All Wheels – 10 mph
- Please be in your camp area by 11 pm. If you stay up late, be courteous of those who go to sleep early.
- Campfire wood is available to buy from the camp – see camp staff for assistance
- Use burn barrels or grills – **NO FIRES ON THE GROUND**
- Shirts are to be worn by men and boys in public at all times
- Place all garbage in the dumpsters
- Use only space necessary for your equipment to save room for other families
- Bikes, canoes and kayaks must be registered with the camp. If you bring your own canoe or kayak, you must follow all posted camp guidelines for boating.
- **All tents and RVs must be spaced at least 15 feet apart, even if from the same family at the same site.**

- Leave your picnic table & burn barrel at your campsite
- Ensure your campsite area is clean
